MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING OF SWANTON ABBOTT HELD ON 4th. OCTOBER 2022 at 7.00p.m. in the VILLAGE HALL, SWANTON ABBOTT.

PRESENT –Cllrs. Vaughan (Chair), A Brown, S. Day & R Ford, the Clerk G Kimmerling, NCC & NNDC Cllr. Penfold, & 5 members of the public.

Open session for members of the public to speak.

There is an on-going problem with drainage at Trunnyuns which has caused subsidence. This has been reported to the authorities but keeping drainage ditches clear is the responsibility of the landowners. Cllr. Vaughan said the Parish Council cleared the drains in 2018 (amended to 2019 by e-mail) and the channel doesn't need to be any deeper.

A statement was made that the Parish Council should be beyond reproach and should work for the whole village. It failed to carry out proper procedures for coption and the speaker had concerns about the people who had been co-opted. Two Village Plans showed support for affordable housing and the Parish Council should also support this.
