23.53	NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL AND NORTH NORFOLK DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORTS. Given after item 23.58. by NNDC & NCC Cllr. Penfold. NNDC has 25 Liberal Democrat councillors, 12 Conservatives & 3 Independents. They have put together a Corporate Priorities Plan covering environmental issues, climate change to reach net 0 by 2030 and quality of life issues. The Sustainable Committees Fund has donated to the Village Hall Toilets, the Woodland area and the Chapel. The Local Plan to 2036, which includes Planning, has been sent to His Magister's Inspectorate for approval. This includes the 1800 properties West of North Walsham. A problem here could be the bottleneck at Coltishall. The County Council has a Warm & Well Winter campaign which can be viewed online. A new magazine – Your Norfolk – will be issued soon. On December 12th. NCC will vote on the County Deal for Norfolk which is the Governments devolution plan. £20m extra could be available over the next 30 years and the County Council would have extra powers & responsibilities. A leader has to be elected – not necessarily from Councillors. One downside is another layer of government which would cost money. Cllr. Penfold is meeting with Highways on December 6th or 8th to visit parishes which will include Swanton Abbott. The Chair will attend this. There could be funds towards the Village Hall ramp.
