

MEMBERS' CODE OF CONDUCT

Introduction to the Code

This Code of Conduct is a key part of the Council's discharge of the statutory duty to promote and maintain high standards of conduct by its members and co-opted members. It is very much focused upon the principles of conduct in public life of selflessness, integrity, objectivity, accountability, openness, honesty and leadership and it is the intention of the Council that the Code be used exclusively in that context and not for any other purpose. It sets an objective, non political and high standard whose purpose is to remind (co-opted) members of the Council of the behaviour expected of them in public life and to set out clearly the key principles against which their conduct will be measured.

The Code also contains provisions for registration and declaration on interests the breach of which will now attract potential criminal sanctions.

North Norfolk District Council will establish a Standards Committee to hear breaches of the Code and decide on sanctions against members found to be in default. Working closely with the Council's Monitoring Officer and Independent Person the Standards Committee will oversee a straightforward and robust regime dealing only with substantial ethics and standards issues and filtering out the inconsequential, trivial and vexatious. The Code will deal in broad common sense principles and neither it nor the supporting arrangements are intended to be over technical or over procedural. The wording of the Statute: the Code is the Authority's public statement on the promotion and maintenance of high standards of conduct in public life.

Every member and co-opted member of Tunstead Parish Council must sign an undertaking to observe the Code in the terms set out below:

The Code

As a member or co-opted member of Swanton Parish Council I have a responsibility to represent the community and work constructively with our staff and partner organisations to secure better social, economic and environmental outcomes for all.

In accordance with the Localism Act provisions, when acting in this capacity I am committed to behaving in a manner that is consistent with the following principles to achieve best value for our residents and maintain public confidence in this Council.

- **SELFLESSNESS:** As a holder of public office a (co-opted) member should act solely in terms of the public interest. He/she should not do so in order to gain financial or other material benefits for themselves, his/her family or his/her friends.
- **INTEGRITY:** As a holder of public office a (co-opted) member should not place him/herself under any financial or other obligation to outside individuals or organisations that might seek to influence him/her in the performance of his/her official duties.
- **OBJECTIVITY:** In carrying out public business, including making public appointments, awarding contracts or recommending individuals for rewards and benefits, as a holder of public office a (co-opted) member should make choices on merit.

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- **ACCOUNTABILITY:** As a holder of public office a (co-opted) member is accountable for his/her decisions and actions to the public and must submit him/herself to whatever scrutiny is appropriate to his/her office.
- **OPENNESS:** As a holder of public office a (co-opted) member should be as open as possible about all the decisions and actions that he/she takes. He/she should give reasons for his/her decisions and restrict information only when the wider public interest clearly demands.
- **HONESTY:** As a holder of public office a (co-opted) member has a duty to declare any private interest relating to his/her public duties and to take steps to resolve any conflicts arising in a way that protects the public interest.
- **LEADERSHIP:** As a holder of public office a (co-opted) member should promote and support these principles by leadership and example.

As a Member of Swanton Abbott Parish Council my conduct will in particular address the statutory principles of the Code by:

- Championing the needs of residents – the whole community and in a special way my constituents, including those who did not vote for me – and putting their interest first.
- Dealing with representations or enquiries from residents, members of our community and visitors fairly, appropriately and impartially.
- Not allowing other pressures, including the financial interests of myself or others connected to me, to deter me from pursuing the residents' casework, the interests of Swanton Abbott Parish Council nor the good governance of the Council on a proper manner.
- Exercising independent judgement on not compromising my position by placing myself under obligations to outside individuals or organisations who might seek to influence the way I perform my duties as a (co-opted) member of this Council.
- Listening to the interest of all parties, including relevant advice from statutory and other professional officers, taking all relevant information into consideration, remaining objective and making decisions on merit.
- Being accountable for my decisions and co-operating when scrutinised internally and externally, including local residents.
- Contributing to making this Council's decision-making processes as open and transparent as possible to enable residents to understand the reasoning behind those decisions and to be informed when holding me and other (co-opted) members to account but restricting access to information when the wider public interest or the law requires it.
- Behaving in accordance with all our legal obligations, alongside any requirements contained within this Council's policies, protocols and procedures, including on the use of the Council's resources.
- Valuing my colleagues and staff and engaging with them in an appropriate manner and one that underpins the mutual respect between us that is essential to good local government.

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- Always treating people with respect, including the organisations and public I engage with and those I work alongside.
- Providing leadership through behaving in accordance with these principles when championing the interest of the community with other organisations as well as within this Council.
